Director Cappelli called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. and the following Commissioners answered to their name:

It is noted for the record that due to the Coronavirus pandemic, all Commissioners participated virtually, except for Deputy Director McDonnell and Director Cappelli.

Due to the Coronavirus pandemic, the meeting was closed to the public attending in person. The public was availed the opportunity to participate via live streaming and to send in questions during and after the meeting.

The Director said this meeting has been properly advertised in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

The Director asked for a moment of silence for Camden County Prosecutor's Office Investigator John McLaughlin and Haddon Heights Police Officer John Norcross and their families on the 26th Anniversary of the tragic event that occurred in Haddon Heights.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the Director proceeded with the Caucus Agenda. Director Cappelli said we will have three (3) First Readings on Bond Ordinances and a Public Hearing at Thursday's meeting. Public hearings on all three (3) matters will be held virtually on May 20, 2021 at 12:00 noon and will be streamed live via www.camdencounty.com/live. Members of the public are welcomed and encouraged to view and participate in the public hearings via the live feed.

FIRST READING #1

Bond Ordinance further amending a Bond Ordinance finally adopted January 21, 2016, as amended by Bond Ordinances finally adopted October 19, 2017, September 17, 2018, October 17, 2019 and June 18, 2020 by the County of Camden, State of New Jersey, in order to provide for a further change in the improvements authorized by such ordinance.

FIRST READING #2

Bond Ordinance amending a Bond Ordinance finally adopted July 16, 2020, by the County of Camden, State of New Jersey, in order to provide for a change in the improvements authorized by such ordinance.

FIRST READING #3

Bond Ordinance amending a Bond Ordinance finally adopted June 15, 2017, by the County of Camden, State of New Jersey, in order to provide for a change in the improvements authorized by such ordinance.

PUBLIC HEARING

Bond Ordinance of the County of Camden, New Jersey, in connection with various improvements for Camden County College, appropriating \$1,500,000 therefor, and providing for the issuance of \$1,500,000 in Bonds or Notes of the County to Finance such appropriation.
