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On the behalf of the Office of Juvenile Defense Services (OJDS), the Camden Trial Region of the Office of the Public Defender is grateful to the County Youth Services for this resource booklet. Children are different. They are not merely smaller versions of adults. They are a vulnerable and precious part of our community afforded special protection. When a child enters the criminal justice system, the family court endeavors to find rehabilitative solutions while tackling complex legal and social issues. In a juvenile delinquency case, because the family court has jurisdiction over the child and the child's family, the judge can explore the wide range of dispositional options to meet the goal of rehabilitation. The options available to the court are enhanced community-based programs and resources.

In 2022, the Youth Services Commission proudly supported over 8,500 youth in Camden County and an additional 600 families through navigation of services.

This 2023 Camden County Youth Services Commission Program Services Guide further enriches and enhances services available to Camden County's youth population by offering wide-ranging services. The resources contained herein include delinquency prevention resources, diversionary services, detention alternatives, dispositional options, and community-based services.

**The Camden County Youth Services Commission** is the single county designated entity responsible for the planning, implementation, and monitoring of a community-based plan of sanctions and services for youth adjudicated or charged as delinquent and delinquency prevention programs.

The Camden County Youth Services Commission is comprised of high-level policy makers, parents, youth, and youth serving organizations in Camden County that are dedicated to developing and delivering effective and accessible programs and services that help youth, young adults, and families reach their full potential.

Our Vision is to provide equitable opportunities so children, youth, and families in our region can thrive through advocacy for accessible, culturally relevant, responsive, and an integrated and coordinated system of care for youth and families.

#### POINTS OF INTERVENTION DEFINITIONS

Each of the programs supported by the Camden County Youth Services Commission Continuum of Care has a specific goal.

**PREVENTION:** To prevent youth from engaging in anti-social and delinquent behavior and from taking part in other problem behaviors that are pathways to delinquency.

**DIVERSION:** To provide services and/or informal sanctions to youth who have begun to engage in anti-social and low-level delinquent behavior to prevent youth from continuing a delinquent pathway.

**DETENTION/DETENTION ALTERNATIVE:** To ensure youth's presence at court hearings and to provide short term (45-60 days) supervision sufficient to safely maintain appropriate youth in the community while awaiting the final disposition of their case.

**DISPOSITION:** To provide the court and probation with a range of options that match the supervision and service needs of youth in their communities to reduce recidivism.

**REENTRY:** To provide youth transitioning from JJC residential programs and youth returning from secure facilities with additional support for successful reintegration into their communities to reduce recidivism

Following identification of eligible program participants, a designated CCC mentor will engage with our YSC liaison (and the candidate) to conduct a needs assessment and placement determination. Thereafter, testing and/or other related student support services are provided to ensure an appropriate destination program, provision of instructional materials, and access to other College resources all while removing any barriers along the way.

The third workshop reviews ways to implement stress free environments where people are mindful of each other's backgrounds and experiences. The youth sessions are a bit of all of these mixed into one. It is an interactive session that youth have enjoyed in previous years at the Youth Summit. While this sounds like it may be too much, it is presented in a way to provide youth an understanding of how much harder it is to work to be peaceful and resolve conflict without negative behaviors. ## Don't Get Vaped In – Tobacco Free for a Healthy New Jersey:

Tobacco Free for a Healthy NJ (TBFHNJ), a program funded by the NJ Department of Health, recognizes that vaping has become an epidemic among our middle and high school students. According to data from CDC and the FDA's National Youth Tobacco Survey, the percentage of high school children reporting past 30-day use of e-cigarettes rose by more than 75% between 2017 and 2018.

In a response to this alarming trend TFHNJ has created a comprehensive, multi strategy approach. These strategies include the Youth Tobacco Action Groups, the creation of a Vaping Policy Toolkit, and the "Don't Get Vaped In" training initiative. Each of these strategies have been put in place to engage youth tobacco prevention and assist schools and communities in responding effectively using educational and supportive approaches.

- Adult to Adult Training: School personnel, parents, and community with Don't Get Vaped In: The Next Generation of Tobacco Addiction.
- Adult to Youth Training: Health teachers, prevention educators and other adults teaching youth utilizing the Don't Get Vaped In curriculum.
- Youth to Youth Training: This version is for youth leaders to utilize as a framework for peer-to-peer education. This Peer-to-Peer model is the ideal way to have youth educate their peers about the dangers of vaping and e-cigarettes. This curriculum can be useful "as is" or be re-designed (content remains) by your youth group.

With this training you will receive a training manual complete with PowerPoints with corresponding talking points to guide your presentation. # Teaching Consent:

In today's culture, young people are bombarded with messages about sex and consent. Across genders, youth are often navigating these messages and their own boundaries without a firm understanding of what it means to give consent. Given the high numbers of sexual assault, it is critical for youth to learn to distinguish between the myths and the facts. In this workshop, students will learn what consent is, why it is necessary and how to ensure that consent is freely given, every time.
