CAMDEN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MEETING

The meeting was called to order by Director Cappelli at 12:00 p.m.

The Clerk called the roll and the following Commissioners answered:

The Director stated that adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

The Director asked everyone to rise for a moment of Silence and the Pledge of Allegiance. Commissioner Young requested a moment of silence for Nina Green Sinclair, the beloved daughter of Nidia Sinclair who works at the Camden County One Stop.

The Director said good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the meeting of the Camden County Board of Commissioners.

The Director said we begin today's meeting with a Public Hearing on a Bond Ordinance.

Bond Ordinance of the County of Camden, New Jersey, in connection with various improvements for Camden County College, appropriating \$3,095,000 therefor, and providing for the issuance of \$3,095,000 in Bonds or Notes of the County to finance such appropriation.

Director Cappelli opened the public hearing to anyone who would like to comment.

Dr. Abraham, 516 Royden Street, Camden. Dr. Abraham asked how the \$3,095,000 was going to be funded and paid back. Are you collecting interest? No interest is shown on the Bond Ordinance. Director Capelli asked CFO Steve Williams to respond to Dr. Abraham's questions. Mr. Williams said this is an annual allocation for Camden County College. All capital improvements at the College are funded by the County. This specifically is an annual allocation that is agreed upon and voted on by the Board of School Estimates of which Director Cappelli is a member. Fifty percent of this amount is actually subsidized by the State. By participating in this \$3,000,000 annual allotment the State actually pays the County 50% of the cost of the debt service, what we pay back on this. Of all the borrowings that we do, this is actually the most beneficial for the County to participate in that we receive 50% reimbursement of the amount we pay back from the State. It is actually a net gain in that we are receiving more from the State in

subsidy than we are in paying interest. Mr. Williams said, I would be happy to talk to you more if you would like after the meeting.

Seeing no one else wishing to speak, the Director asked for a motion to close the public hearing. Deputy Director McDonnell made a motion with a second by Commissioner Young and on roll call all Commissioners present voted aye.

Director Cappelli asked for a motion to adopt the Ordinance. Commissioner Young made a motion with a second by Commissioner Kane and all Commissioners present voted aye.

We also celebrated May Brill on May 10th. Anyone who has any connection with the military community in South Jersey knows May. She is about 4 feet tall and 100 years old and is a World War II Veteran. One hundred and fifty of her closest friends came out to celebrate her. She is instrumental in Camden County in speaking out about women who serve in the military. She is an amazing spokesperson for women and mentors many, many in our community. Camden County Office of Veterans Affairs has been busy flagging cemeteries in preparation for Memorial Day. We will be flagging all the cemeteries within Camden County and placing approximately 30,000 flags in the upcoming days. Our County's Memorial Day ceremony will be held on May 24th at 10 AM at the Camden County Veteran's Cemetery at Harleigh. I encourage everyone to come out for this ceremony. Following the 10 AM ceremony we will have a light lunch and then be proceeding to New Camden and Evergreen Cemeteries where we will be flagging the veterans at those cemeteries.

Commissioner Dyer said this past week we hosted the 85th Annual Dad Vail Regatta. It was truly an amazing experience for me and the residents of Camden County. This is the largest collegiate rowing championship in the United States. We also hosted a Welcome Event which went very well. Ginny and I passed out the championship medals on the floating platform. The floating platform was something that was requested last year. Speaking to the members of the Dad Vail Board they said it was a game changer. The fact that the rowers can row up to the dock and receive their medals right on the water was incredible. The economic impact was phenomenal. Next year we may host the event again. They will be making that decision and announcement in June. We had two jumbotrons, but for next year they have requested another jumbotron at the finish line so rowers can see themselves coming across the finish line. They have also requested a bigger finish line tower so they can have more media in the tower and do more technology from the tower. They also just requested rails on the dock steps. It was a great experience. I never really thought I would enjoy the Dad Vail Regatta that much on Friday or that I would come back on Saturday.

We also offered senior golf lessons last week which went very well. You have to be a Camden County resident and our seniors are truly enjoying our trainer who is doing a great job over there at the Driving Range. The place has never looked better. We have 300-500 people every day coming to the Drive Range. It is getting a lot of play. This is a good thing for Camden County. There is no other driving range in the County. The closest golf course is Pennsauken, but they do not have a driving range. People from all over come to use the driving range.

Commissioner Betteridge said I want to give a shout out to our Camden County team. I have been to many events this month and they are just amazing. The dedication and the hard work put forth by our employees just make it a celebratory month. The Camden County Department of Health hosted the 50th anniversary of the Carol Norcross Senior Center a few days ago. It went delightfully well. We had over 100 seniors and we were joined by Congressman Norcross who paid tribute to his month. I want to thank the staff for everything they do down there in keeping

our seniors safe and providing healthy, nutritious meals.

Commissioner Deputy Director McDonnell said congratulations to all the Best of the Class awardees. It was a great event. I would also like to thank all our employees for all the great work they do every day.

Commissioner Director Cappelli said I would also like to thank the employees. Since our last meeting we had the Special Needs Prom at the Aquarium which was probably one of the best events I have ever been to. It was phenomenal and our folks did a great job. The plant sale, the Down and Derby, the Dad Vail Regatta and Best of the Class were all fabulous events. You guys all knocked it out of the park this month. It was a fantastic month. Our residents should be proud. I know we are!

The Director asked for a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Young made a motion with a second by Commissioner Dyer and all Commissioners voted aye. The meeting was adjourned at 12:18 p.m.
