Introduction and Background

The Camden County Division of Senior & Disabled Services was among the first county offices on aging in the state when it was created by the Camden County Freeholders in 1967. It was 1968 before the office had a small budget and a one-person staff.

Under these limitations the office organized local senior citizen groups and provided some recreation. The agency's scope grew after being designated an Area Agency on Aging in 1973 and assumed the local responsibilities for implementation of the Federal Older Americans Act. Today, the Camden County Division of Senior & Disabled Services administers a budget totaling more than \$4.5 million and supervises numerous senior programs throughout the county. In addition, the Division of Senior Services serves as the central clearinghouse for all senior programs in the county, regardless of their funding sources.

In 1998 The Camden County Division of Senior & Disabled Services became a part of NJ EASE (Easy Access Single Entry). NJ EASE is a new and easy way for seniors to obtain information and services. NJ EASE means a single agency will service the needs of our seniors and their family members.

In the early summer of 2012, the Camden County Division of Senior and Disabled Services became ADRC (Aging and Disability Resource Connection) accessible. The ADRC (Aging and Disability Resource Connection) is a program to connect seniors aged 60 & older and people with physical disabilities 18 years of age and older with the services they need to continue living independently in the community for as long as possible. The ADRC serves as your doorway to information and assistance on the full range of public and private long-term care services available in New Jersey. The ADRC strongly supports consumer-directed care in which the consumer is in control of making personal care decisions based on assessed need, informed choice, and community service availability.

In 2015, the Camden County Board of Commissioners held a dedication and ribbon cutting of the new Carol C. Norcross Senior Social Wellness Center in Blackwood, New Jersey. The center is dedicated to Carol Norcross, the inspirational director of the senior day center. Under her leadership, the program and center expanded to further her vision of keeping senior citizens active and socially engaged. Carol, the mother of Congressman Donald Norcross, served Camden County residents for two decades.





Purpose of the Social Wellness Center

To provide the opportunity to active adults for individual social interaction and companionship with their peers in a quality environment. To support and enhance the sense of personal worth and independence through meaningful activities and programs. To offer support systems for families with care giving responsibilities. To offer a comprehensive active adult program which stresses a holistic approach to meet the physical, emotional and social needs of its members which will delay, reduce or prevent inappropriate or premature institutionalization of the older person.

Our center is free to Camden County residents 60 years or older (a small fee is required for crafts). The center is open from 8 AM until 4 PM, Monday through Friday. Participants may attend the center two or three days per week.

Services & Activities

Services and activities at the Senior Social Wellness Center include door-to-door transportation, lunch and nutrition programs, ceramics, woodworking, needlecraft, sewing, painting, board and parlor games, movement programs, educational and community service programs, health screening information and referral services, social services assistance, daily grocery and personal shopping trips.

Eligibility & Registration

Must be a resident of Camden County, Age 60 or over who is self-medicating, ambulatory and social functioning. To apply or to receive additional information regarding this or any other senior citizen benefit plan, call us at 856-374-6005.

state or federal government. Sponsors of this housing include non-profit or limited profit

organizations or public housing authorities.

According to the Federal Administration on Aging, preference for federally funded housing is

given to people who are paying more than 50% of their income in rent, are being displaced from

their homes or live in inadequate housing. In some buildings recreational activities and support

services such as meals, housekeeping or transportation are provided. Some facilities offer

congregate services (housekeeping, meals, & personal assistance) that may be included in the

rent or purchased separately.

The DTB Director is responsible for activating the state's mental health disaster response plan in coordination with the NJDHS Emergency Social Services Coordinator and the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management, during a declared disaster. This includes natural disasters (floods, hurricanes, snowstorms, forest fires) and man-made disasters (economic downturn, terrorist attacks, traffic disasters, international evacuations due to war, etc.). Services include crisis counseling, psychological first aid, consultation and training, information and referral, and toll-free warm line services.

PATCO

PATCO's Reduced Fare Program (RFP) allows eligible individuals to travel between any two PATCO stations during off-peak hours for \$0.70, regardless of distance traveled. The reduced fare is set as half the lowest full fare. To take advantage of the RFP discount, you must apply and qualify for the RFP FREEDOM Smart Card.

Eligibility

Medicare Card Holders

Senior Citizens: All persons 65 years of age or older.

Disabled: Persons with certain physical challenges, including anyone with a Medicare card. Discounts available on weekends: All day Saturday and Sunday, weekdays: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., and 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

All RFP members will receive a photo ID FREEDOM card. FREEDOM is a stored value card that takes the place of a ticket. Once you load value on the card, touch it on the yellow target at the fare gate. The computerized fare collection system records your entry. The time you enter determines whether you ride at the discounted or full fare. Come in person to a FREEDOM Card Service Center to sign up and have your picture taken.

Please bring a Medicare Card and photo ID.

Seniors - Please bring with you a photo ID and proof of age (driver's license, birth certificate, Medicare card, or other document showing your date of birth).

Disabled - If you have a Medicare card, bring it and photo ID to Broadway. In lieu of a Medicare card, persons with physical challenges should call 1-877-373-6777. Bring the application, including a statement by a currently licensed, practicing physician describing and certifying the degree of disability and that this disability significantly impairs one's ability to use public mass transportation, to the Customer Service Center at Broadway. Eligibility status may be limited by the nature and type of disability.

Your FREEDOM card is balance protected. If you lose your card, call 1-877-FRDM-777 (1-877-373-6777). From the moment you notify us, the balance will be held for you and placed on another card. (The cost to replace a lost card is \$5.)

The new FREEDOM fare collection system includes new, wider, ADA-compliant fare gates at all PATCO stations. Elevators are located at Lindenwold, Ashland, Woodcrest, Haddonfield, Westmont, Collingswood, Ferry Avenue, Broadway, 8th & Market, 9/10th & Locust and 15/16th & Locust Street Stations. All other stations (except City Hall and 9th/Locust Street) have an escalator that operates in the "up" direction.

If you're a senior or a person with a disability, you can enjoy greater traveling freedom and lower fares! When you ride with NJ TRANSIT's Reduced Fare Program, you can save 50% or more on a regular one-way fare.

Special rates are available for seniors 62 years of age* or older and people with disabilities. Personal assistants ride for free when proper identification is presented by the person with a disability. And you don't need to be a New Jersey resident to be eligible for the program. * 65 years of age for travel to/from Metro-North Railroad stations.

You can ride on <u>all NJ TRANSIT</u> buses, trains, and light rail vehicles at the reduced rate. Many private bus companies operating in the state also participate in the program.

Seniors 62 and older and people with disabilities may take advantage of the reduced fare <u>at any</u> time on all trains, buses, and light rail vehicles.

Passengers with disabilities simply show your valid NJ TRANSIT Reduced Fare ID or Medicare Card to the bus operator, light rail vehicle operator, or train conductor and present the appropriate fare. Seniors may be asked to present a valid ID to get the reduced fare.

Allowable IDs for seniors 62 and older include any ID or document printed with your date of birth and issued by a government, social service, or mass transportation agency. This includes an NJ TRANSIT Reduced Fare ID; Medicare Card; Valid Driver's License; Valid Passport; Birth Certificate; Valid State-Issued Non-Driver's ID; County, Medicaid, or Military ID; MTA Reduced Fare Card; PATH Senior Fare Card; or PA Senior Citizen Transit ID or PACE Card. On interstate private buses (most buses not marked NJ TRANSIT), you must also present a Reduced Fare Coupon each time you ride.

Since 1993, the Division of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DDHH) has operated a program to ensure that New Jersey residents with hearing loss, regardless of their economic status, have access to critical telecommunications and visual alerting home safety equipment needed to live independently.

The "Equipment Distribution Program" is now offering wireless devices. Offering these devices works to ensure that deaf and hard of hearing residents have access to critical information, services and supports being delivered remotely through online platforms that include telehealth services, emergency information, telecommunications, and other vital communication needs.

Individuals unable to afford the costs of assistive communication devices may apply to the "Equipment Distribution Program" for assistance. Upon meeting eligibility requirements, individuals may receive communication devices free of cost from the DDHH.

Hearing Assistance to the Aged and Disabled

Hearing Aid Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (HAAAD)

Program Summary

- · HAAAD provides a \$500 reimbursement to offset the purchase of a hearing aid, or \$1,000 for two hearing aids.
- One reimbursement is allowed per calendar year. If a hearing aid is purchased in a subsequent calendar year, a new HAAAD application is required.
- "Hearing Aid" means a custom-fitted ear-level or body-worn electronic device which enhances communication for the hearing impaired.
- · Beneficiaries must be currently enrolled in the Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (PAAD) program or Lifeline Utility Assistance (Lifeline) program, or;
- · Meet the PAAD and Lifeline eligibility criteria described below.

Program Criteria

If you are currently enrolled in the PAAD or Lifeline program, you must complete a HAAAD application and submit the following documentation:

- · A receipt for the purchase of your hearing aid.
- · A written statement from your physician attesting to the medical necessity for obtaining a hearing aid.

If you are NOT currently enrolled in the PAAD or Lifeline program, you must complete an NJSave Application online.

Disabled Placards and License Plates

Individuals who meet the medical qualifications are eligible to choose from one of three options:

- One (1) set of wheelchair symbol license plates
- One (1) person with a disability placard
- One (1) set of plates and one placard

Qualified applicants receive one set of wheelchair symbol license plates for a vehicle registered either to the qualified person with a disability OR to one family member who provides the qualified person with transportation (aka driver). See the Qualifications page for detailed information.

The *Persons with a Disability* placard will authorize the driver to park any vehicle in a wheelchair symbol parking space so long as the qualified person designated on the *Person with a Disability Identification Card* is in the vehicle and has their ID card with them.

The individual who holds the *Person with a Disability Identification Card* must be in the vehicle or with the driver at all times as proof of disability. The Card is non-transferable and must be with on the individual at all times to utilize the wheelchair symbol parking privileges.

Non-Drivers ID

New Jersey residents 14 years of age and older may apply for a non-driver photo identification (ID). The non-driver ID is issued solely for the purpose of providing identification and is not a license to drive.

If customers have driver's licenses from another state, they are not eligible for a non-driver ID card. Customers that are suspended can downgrade to non-driver ID Card until their suspension is resolved. Customers can schedule an appointment and complete and bring a Non-driver ID Application (Form BA-208).

This non-driver identification card must be obtained by scheduling an appointment at any Licensing Center.

The fee for renewal of the non-driver ID card is \$24, the fee for a duplicate or lost ID card is \$11.

Renew your non-driver ID online

Obtaining a non-driver identification card

- All initial non-driver identification cards must be obtained in-person by <u>scheduling an appointment</u> and any Licensing Center.
- Complete the Application for Permit/License/Non-Driver ID (Form BA-208).
- Pass the <u>6 Points of ID</u> requirements.
- Pay the \$24 fee. For your convenience, the MVC accepts American Express® card, MasterCard®, Visa® card, Discover card®, checks, money orders and cash.
- Your new non-driver ID will be mailed to you.

Obtaining a non-driver identification card (persons with a disability)

Any New Jersey resident 14 years of age and older with a disability can apply for a non-driver ID, issued solely for the purpose of providing identification. It is not a license to drive and cannot be used to park in a person(s) with a disability parking space. There is no renewal fee for this non-driver ID card. - Follow the steps noted above to obtain a non-driver ID card. In addition, have a physician complete the <u>Physician Certification for Blind or Disabled Person</u>, Non-Driver ID Application.
- A \$6 fee will apply. For your convenience, the MVC accepts American Express® card, MasterCard®, Visa® card, Discover card®, checks, money orders and cash.
